Why we got involved

The school had been working with LTL on the Space to Grow project developing the outside classroom. We created our own allotment last year in the infant playground and used much of what we grew for school dinners. We know that many of our pupils do not have any green space at home and are not taken out to the local park etc so having opportunities to get 'stuck in' is an ideal way of enabling them to learn about nature, their food, conservation and re-cycling.

What we made for the garden, to represent the Natural Environment

The mini-beast designs were created by the children, and a local 'creative' volunteer helped the children to put their ideas into practice. They were insistent that the caterpillar should be climbing up the stalk of a flower.

To represent other facets of outdoor learning we also grew vegetables from seed and made two mosaics.

What we learned

All the children were concerned when we had very little rain and they all made sure that each one of them watered the plants every day (Hence the reason some of the plants did not survive – too much TLC from the children!). The work provided very good opportunities for cross-curricular links such as problem solving and calculations, also shape and space in Maths.
